Crispus Attucks, the Black Boston colonial patriot, was an uncommonly large man, tall and brawny, with powerful arms and big hands. Despite his size, he moved fluidly and gracefully, always under control. He escaped from slavery in 1750. He was a drifter of sorts, a man who loved his freedom and knew its worth. Loving freedom, Attucks also loved children for their free and open natures; and he was adored by them. The sight of Attucks on the grass surrounded by scores of children held spellbound by his tales of the sea and far-of lands was not uncommon in the Boston Revolutionary era.
